The Head Owl Hoots

I'm baaack

Not something I was expecting, but here I am. For those who haven't heard, on June 25 Superintendent Pete Lakatos resigned. As assistant superintendent, I rolled into the superintendent's position upon the resignation. With my knowledge of our 45 of our 52-year history, I believe this is the first time this has happened in this Division.

A few days later, Contest Director Dave Evans also resigned.

Both resigned for separate reasons, and as you may know Dave was on a leave from the board as he took care of some family matters.

I would like to thank Pete and Dave for their service to the Division and the hobby. Hopefully they will remain active in other roles.

Fortunately, I was able to quickly fill those positions. Mike Slater volunteered to take on the contest director position, and his appointment was approved at the August board meeting. Jim Hebner has volunteered to take over the webmaster duties (a non-board position) from Pete and that transition is underway. Thank you to Mike and Jim for stepping up.

However, we are far from being out of the woods. On the officer side, we need to fill the Assistant Superintendent (vice president) position, we also need to fill the Chief Clerk (secretary) position in order to operate (thank you to Neil Michel for stepping in temporarily).

Then we are short both a clinic director and layout tour director, and have been for a couple of years. Right now myself, Steve Miazga (newsletter) and Dennis Janssen (paymaster) are filling those roles for this season, but that is NOT a long-term solution. We also need a membership director.

While the board has decided to roll through this meet season as is, if we don't fill the positions soon there will be changes to the Division. For starters, without a full slate of officers our ability to operate will be brought into question. Then, if we fill those, we still have board positions to fill. If we don't, I am proposing we go to two meets a year – fall and spring – with the later fulfilling our annual meeting requirement. We could possibly make them two-day meets. Bus trips, WISEop and the WISE Ride would remain as they are self-sustaining or low/no cost

events. And if we aren't having as many meets, and there is lack of interest in running the Division, then we need to question Trainfest. The show was originally created to fund the Division, but should we bother with all the work if we don't need the funds? It's not an option I like, but being Superintendent, and looking at current volunteer staffing, it has to be considered. Plus I have heard from too many modelers that they don't want to work for the Division or the show - they just want to come and run their trains. Remember, the Division runs Trainfest, not the other way around, and if we don't have the volunteers to run the Division, there isn't a reason to have Trainfest.

It's easy to think, "someone else" will do the work, but with membership down to 180 there aren't as many of those "someone else" as there used to be. Plus those running the Division are not getting younger, and some have served on the board for a long time and deserve a break (and time to maybe work on their own layouts). In short, it's your Division. If members don't want to step up, things will change.

I am setting a time limit of December 1 to have candidates to fill the positions in question. If we don't then I will propose to the board we start rolling things back for the 2019/2020 season. You have time (a few months) to think about it, ask questions and volunteer.

Thus we will be having an emergency membership meeting at 3:00 p.m. at the September 16th meet. I will present any updates and we can discuss the direction we want the Division to take on the matters mentioned above. I encourage you to attend.

In the meantime, if you are interested in a one of the vacant board positions, or have any questions or comments, feel free to contact me.

I'll end this column with some good news. Congratulations to Gary Children for being the recipient of the NMRA's 2018 President's Award for Service to Divisions – Midwest Region. Gary has been on the WISE board for at least 25 years so this recognition is well deserved.


Gary Children Receives NMRA President's Award



Trainfest Update

Trainfest 2018 is progressing nicely and this year we are celebrating the Great Northern railroad. We will again have HO and N scale cars for sale for this road as well as pins and plaques. As of this date we have received 170 applications for space. 59 are for manufacturers (9 new), 35 vendors (2 new) and 81 Layouts and Displays (10 new). We have had 10 manufacturers, 3 vendors and 11 layouts and displays decline to participate in Trainfest 2018 and we are waiting to hear from 14 manufacturers, 7 vendors and 7 layouts and displays who participated last year. If you know of someone who would like to participant in this year's Trainfest, have them contact me directly at kenj@trainfest.com to request an application.

This year we are receiving 1000 "Bridger" locomotive sets from a new manufacturer out of Japan, Fame Toys. So in addition to the Make & Take and Jr Engineer programs we will now have a STEM area where these sets can be purchased, assembled and tested. We have added a new member to the Trainfest committee, Lloyd Steiner, to handle this area.

The only way that Trainfest can be successful is with the help

of many **volunteers**. This year we are reaching out to youth groups to help staff the MLES riding railroad crossings. If you know of a group who would like to attend Trainfest in exchange for one hour of service per participant please have them contact me. In addition, we need **you** to help staff the show. Even if you are at the show working a layout or display you can sign up to work a session which will last approximately 45 minutes. There are many other places where people can help. So, if you are willing, please sign up through the website www.trainfest.com.

Tickets sales, clinic listings and the Trainfest Store are all up and running on the website. Local hobby shops will have tickets to sell by the beginning of September.

Remember Trainfest is your show. Let me or other committee members know what you would like to see in the future.

Prevent Elder Abuse: Recognize the Signs and Common Scams

No matter how careful you are, anyone can become a victim of financial fraud. However, older adults are particularly at risk. Those who commit elder fraud range from loved ones—family members, friends, or caregivers—to complete strangers. In its financial form, elder abuse is the exploitation of senior citizens to gain access to their property, investments, cash, or real estate. Learn about common elder abuse scams and red flags below. You could prevent a loved one from becoming a victim.

Common Scams

- Grandma Scams "Hi Grandma! It's your favorite grandkid calling, and I need your help." Many seniors find it difficult to resist pleas like this and are more than willing to immediately wire money to their "grandchild" in need. The most important thing to do in this scenario is to verify the caller. Most scammers will plead with their "grandparent" not to tell anyone, but if you receive a call like this the fastest way to determine if the request is real is to contact another family member. Do not wire money or provide a credit card number until you've verified the identity of the caller.
- ◆ "Free" Prize or Cruise Calls Scammers call to inform an elderly consumer that they've won a sweepstakes prize or free cruise-they just need to send a "processing fee" or "cover shipping costs" to collect their winnings or tickets. Sometimes, these callers go straight to asking for credit card or bank account numbers. The best way to avoid this scam is to simply hang up. It is illegal to charge a fee to enter a sweepstakes. If the caller says you've won a cruise, ask what cruise line is involved and then verify the contest.
- ◆ Fake Charities This type of scam is especially popular after a well-publicized natural disaster. The scammer solicits "donations" and sometimes provides official-looking documents to prove the charity exists. When donating money, it's best to go through a well-known company and verify the organization or charity through the Better Business Bureau.

Red Flags for Abuse

- ♦ Isolation The number one tactic used by perpetrators is to separate the victim from family and/or friends who would stop the abuse. Watch for victims to stop attending social events or even disconnect their phone line.
- Changes in spending habits Drastic changes in account balances or unusually flamboyant purchases like cars and real estate are a sign that the senior citizen is not the person in charge of their finances. Keep a close eye on lavish "gifts" to new friends or acquaintances.
- Unfamiliar names on joint accounts Sometimes perpetrators convince their victims that they will help them organize their finances by creating a joint account. In reality, this gives the perpetrator unlimited access to the victim's funds. If a senior citizen wants another person to manage their finances, they should use a Power of Attorney (POA) account instead, which puts a legal obligation on the co-signer to protect the elderly person's interests.


WISERide Bike Tour
